

International Summit at A World of Accordions

A World of Accordions Museum located in Superior, Wisconsin hosted an International Summit to showcase the Museum holdings during a recent event organized by curator Helmi Harrington, Ph. D.

The International conference included three Executive members of the Confédération Internationale des Accordéonistes (CIA) Kevin Friedrich - Ambassador (USA), Harley Jones - Public Relations Manger (New Zealand) and Dr. Herbert Scheiben-




reif - Vice President (Austria) as well as Heather Masefield - Executive Officer of the New Zealand Accordion Association.

The Summit was supported by the new Superior, WI, Mayor Jim Paine as well as 6th District Councilor Tylor Elm, the Director of Marketing and Social Media Nikky Farmakes as well as other guests from the Visitors and Convention Bureau and local Universities, the Museum Board of Directors and guests.

After an official welcome and remarks by CIA World Accordion Museum Alliance Director Kevin Friedrich, speakers included Dr. Herbert Scheibenreif, Harley Jones, Heather Masefield, Helmi Harrington, Ph. D., Mayor Jim Paine and Museum Repair Technician student David Beer. The guests were given a guided tour of the Museum holdings before concluding with a meet and greet reception.

Museum Curator Helmi Harrington presented an overview of Museum activities and holdings including the 1300 instruments on display, more than one million pieces of sheet music, refer-



ence books and recordings, featured Concert Series guest artists such as renowned classical Russian accordionists Friedrich Lips and Viatcheslav Semionov to popular Grammy Award winning Joey Miskulin, the exciting World Accordion Day and Willard Palmer festivals, the Musical Estates of dignitaries such as Willard Palmer, Ernest Deffner, Pietro Diero, Charles Magnante and others entrusted to the Museum, the new online resources such as sales and Educational items, the new Fundraising Campaign 'Superior Vision' and the unique Repair Technician school.

A World of Accordions Museum is a member of the newly established World Accordion Museum Alliance under the auspices of the CIA which aims to coordinate the efforts of Accordion Museums and collectors around the world to ensure that the historical culture of the accordion is protected for all to enjoy.

Early Music of Ernst Krenek featured in London Show

London based Ian Watson was the featured accordionist in the Aurora Orchestra during the popular show 'Barry Humphries' Weimar Cabaret' which just concluded a month long engagement at the Barbican Center in London. Ian opened the show with Cabaret diva Meow Meow as the orchestra assembled on stage while renowned actor Barry Humphries served as the Emcee of the show which was a tribute to the jazz-infused music of the Weimar Republic.

Best known as Dame Edna Everage, Barry Humphries inserts his witty anecdotes and irreverent asides providing interludes to a treasure trove of songs and instrumentals. Fellow Australian Meow Meow, sings Kurt Weill standards alongside rarities from Friedrich Hollaender, Ernst Krenek and Erwin Schulhoff, all accompanied by London's trailblazing Aurora Orchestra. As the evening progresses it repeatedly highlights how the composers had to leave their homes and reinvent themselves when their work was denounced as degenerate by the Nazis regime.

During the course of his research, Humphries went on to meet and make friends with many of the composers. Kurt Weill later used the accordion in his works such as Mahagonny, The Threepenny Opera, Happy End, Marie Galante, and Lost in the Stars, while Ernst Krenek went on to compose works for accordion including Accomusic for accordion, Op. 225 and Toccata (1964) by Ernst Krenek, a commissioned work by the American Accordionists' Association.

Hanzhi Wang at Carnegie Hall's, Zankel Hall

In 2014, a young girl traveled from Suzhou, China to Copenhagen, Denmark to study with accordion's most renowned pedagogue and is now the first accordionist in the Young Concert Artists' history! Music from Bach to today sounds as if it were writ-



ten for her. The great Russian composer, Sofia Gubaidulina writes, "I heard Hanzhi Wang play my piece, De Profundis. The impact of her playing was enormous, even dazzling. Her technical perfection, the phenomenal quality of feeling evoked through the tone and timbre of her instrument, her understanding of the piece, all were incredible. But still, one part of her performance stood apart: her display of the highest level of inner concentration so memorable as to affect both the soul and spirit."

The concert will take place on Monday, October 22, 2018 in the Zankel Hall at Carnegie Hall. The Zora String Quartet will also perform. Selections include Bach *Partita No. 2 in C minor*, Gubadulina - *De Profundis*, Mozart, *Andante*, K 616, Piazzolla, *Three Tango Selections*, Three pieces by Martin Lohose and Moszkowski *Etincelles*.

THE SEMINARS - 2018

AAA's Master Class & Concert Series

The Seminars this year were an exciting event. Again - new ideas - new concepts - new points of view.

Some of the highlights were: a fascinating new work by Dr. Robert Young Mc Mahan for accordion, clarinet and piano with the unassuming title of Three Tweets.

A St. Anthony's Canon celebrated the life of the late Stanley Darrow performed with care and affection by the accordion quartet, Bachtopus (Mayumi Mayaoka, Denise Koncelik, Jeanne Velonis and Peter Flint).

Will Holshouser gave an enlightened presentation of The Accordion and Counterpoint exploring the linear dimension of the accordion

The Main Squeeze orchestra was a hit combining: Greensleeves with Dr. Denise Koncelik's arrangement of Por Una Cabeza with excerpts from Dr. Schimmel's Symphony #7.

Doug Makofka gave us a new Fugue dimension.

Denise Koncelik's songs based on Margaret Atwood poems were sublime along with Military Bitter Suite, a collaboration with Dr. S, a testament to our troubled times along with her new work performed by her and Jeanne Velonis.

Jeanne performed Dr. Schimmel's Water Still, a tribute to John Cages's Water Walk.

Erica Marie Mancini, who is now on this year's cover of Accordion Babes, gave a presentation of the Accordion and Fashion, restoring the glamour of the accordion.

Paul Stein moderated a discussion on the New York Accordionist and what it takes to work in New York and find that niche. He performed on the Claviola, a rare wind instrument no longer made and Ben Ickies took us through The Polish funeral which still ended with Beer Barrel Polka.

There was a discourse on teaching called Dual Teaching and the Orange Soda Syndrome and Dalcroze specialist Mimi Hsu, put all of us though the paces of accordion and movement.

We had the honor of presenting three musical legends: the Downtown icon - composer and improviser, Elliott Sharp, who gave us a blues teaching from roots to today and New York City Diva, Lauren Flanigan and I decided to take a break from our extensive and exclusive work on Kurt Weill and present Rodgers and Hart through the eyes of the accordion with some classics and a

The great klezmer violinist Alicia Svigals joined Dr. Schimmel in a concert version of Hava Nagila and an improvised Klezmer Classic.

John Foti presented his poetic renderings with his original music.

Bob Goldberg had everyone placed around the Tenri Space in an environmental work.

David First performed on the Vietnamese guitar. David Stoler gave us a wonderful new work for accordion and digital enhancement. (see and hear the video).

Melissa Elledge once again wowed us with her hip hop renderings including a Moondog cover.

Dave Soldier's Lewitt Etudes were robustly played by Dan Cooper on 7 string bass, Denise Koncelik on piano, Dr. Schimmel on melodica and Robert Young McMahan on accordion.

Dr. McMahan played Prelude and Sarabande by George Kleinsinger, an AAA commssioned work and a work by Daniel Galow.

Indi rock star Corn Mo joined Dr. Schimmel in Brel's Ne me quite pas and his work, Dude.

Mary Spencer Knapp, now a Broadway star, played piano in Toot Suite along with Dr. Schimmel and then switched to accordion. Her evolution has been staggering.

Godfrey Nelson and Lorraine Nelson Wolf gave us an Accordion Suite to an Urban beat.

Brian Dewan closed the event with Tom Leher's The Old Dope Peddler and This is my Box by Gian Carlo Menotti from Amahl and the Night Visitors. Dr. Schimmel and harpist Kathryn Andrews premiered a new work by Dr. Schimmel titled Buried Treasure inspired by a segment of the musical Carousel where they both are performing in.

Dr. Hugo Goldenzweig, pianist, joined Dr. Schimmel in a performance of Scenes from Childhood/Scenes from Adulthood combining Schumann with Schimmel. The Yorkvillians: Dan Cooper, Michio Suzuki, Max Maples, Dr. Schimmel performed Atonal Funk written by each of its members. Ken Laufer was terrific on piano in a duo with Dr. S and Lee Mc Clure gave us a work for toy piano, accordion and flute.

World Accordion Orchestra X

Orchestra X will perform three works from three diverse American composers, under the direction of Joan Cochran Sommers.

The first piece Serenata is a classic gem from renowned American composer Leroy Anderson. The second work is by accordionist and composer Amy Jo Sawyer. Amy Jo and WAO conductor Joan C. Sommers were among the first accordionists to represent the USA at the Coupe Mondiale. Amy Jo has written numerous works for accordion orchestra and her lovely work Recuerdos will feature this year. The program will culminate in the magnificent West Side Story as the CIA joins the global centennial celebration in honor of Leonard Bernstein's 100th anniversary.

Conductor Joan C. Sommers, founder of the CIA World Accordion Orchestra was awarded the title of Professor Emerita upon her retirement from the University of Missouri – Kansas City Conservatory of Music (USA), where she established and taught the accordion degree program for forty years. She has arranged innumerable works for the accordion orchestra over many years, often for the UMKC Accordion Orchestra, a large symphonic accordion orchestra, which, under her direction, competed in and won more First Prizes in Virtuoso Accordion Orchestra Competitions than any other similar American group. This is a record still unbroken today.

In both 1955 and 1956 she earned the right to represent the USA in the Coupe Mondiale and, although she didn't win, it was those experiences which opened her eyes to the tremendous opportunities available to accordionists; perhaps it also fixed her life-long interest in worldwide accordion activities. Most recently, she celebrated the 50th Anniversary of her UMKC Accordion Orchestra when they presented their 50th Gala Concert at the University.

As the arranger, Joan has had many years of experience as a teacher, a conductor, and an arranger for accordion orchestras at all levels. Many of these arrangements were used by her own orchestras in competitions held throughout the USA and on the many tours made by her groups overseas as well.

Joan C. Sommers has held positions in several music organizations, including the Accordionists & Teachers Guild International (ATG) and the Confédération Internationale des Accordéonistes (CIA – IMC-UNESCO). Today, Professor Sommers enjoys performing with fellow accordionists in duo, with other instrumentalists and with the UMKC Chamber Accordion Ensemble. In



addition to her performing, she continues to adjudicate, coach soloists, prepare accordion orchestra arrangements, and conduct accordion orchestras regularly. After her retirement as CIA Vice President, she was unanimously awarded the status of CIA Honorary Member.

The first World Accordion Orchestra was held in 2007 at the Coupe Mondiale festival jointly hosted by the AAA and the ATG in Alexandria, VA. This year, among the north American accordionists participating in WAO X under the direction of Joan C. Sommers, are Mary Tokarski (AAA President), Nathan Chapeton (AAA Junior Coupe Mondiale representative), Kevin Friedrich (AAA Board Member and CIA Ambassador), Beverly Fess (Canadian CIA Representative). ■





Lauded as "a wizard of the accordion," Michael Bridge is internationally-renowned for his warm stage personality, stereotype-smashing versatility, and blazing virtuosity. Named one of CBC's "30 Hot Classical Musicians Under 30", he made his solo orchestral debut with the Boston Pops at 17 and gives over 100 concerts per year in Europe and the Americas. Encompassing the diversity of his live performances, his debut album, "Overture", launched in 2018 and was named CBC Album of the Week.

More than a classical musician, Michael simply describes his repertoire as 'concert music' – encompassing baroque, classical, and contemporary works, along with a vast array of his own concert arrangements of folk and jazz music. Armed with both acoustic and digital accordions, all sounds emanating from the stage (up to the sound of a full orchestra) are played 100% live. Prolific in working with composers, Michael has given over 40 world premieres.

Equally adept performing with orchestras, playing an energetic outdoor festival, or giving a TED Talk, Michael is a recipient of the Lieutenant Governor of Alberta's Emerging Artist Medal, and winner of the University of Toronto Concerto Competition, the Canadian Digital Accordion Championships and the Calgary Stampede Talent Search.

On tour, Michael performs solo or with orchestra, and with his two ensembles – Bridge+Wolak and Ladom Ensemble. He has toured in Poland, France, Italy, the U.K., Ecuador, the USA and in every Canadian province.

Michael is pursuing doctoral studies in accordion performance at the University of Toronto, studying with Joseph Macerollo. He gives frequent guest lectures at universities and festivals on topics including The Music Business for Student, Performance and Speaking Skills, and Composing for Accordion. He has adjudicated accordion competitions in Canada and the USA.
