AAA Welcomes Two New Members to Their Board of Directors

Two accordionists were recently welcomed as new members of the AAA Board of Directors. Please welcome Don Gerundo and Emilio Magnotta.

DON GERUNDO

Don Gerundo is an active accordionist and pianist performing in the New York metropolitan area. He is a versatile keyboardist who plays various styles ranging from popular American Standards from the American Songbook, Jazz and Rock 'n' Roll. He works with



the Bensen-Scott Big Band, an 18 piece Jazz band, has worked with a Rockabilly small group as well as society combos and Top 40 groups. He has performed and accompanied Lenny Welch (hit record "Since I Fell For You"), Joe Piscopo and has performed at Swing 46 in New York City, White Plains Theatre for the Arts, Coney Island Park and other large venues.

Don started playing the accordion at age 10. During his later teens he studied with Tony Mecca (a native of Waterbury, CT.) Tony introduced him to popular and Jazz music and worked with him on harmony, theory, voicings and improvisation. During this time he started to perform club dates with some of the local leaders in the New York metropolitan area, as well as working at resorts in the New York Catskill area. This "on-the-job" training helped hone

his Jazz skills, as well as build his repertoire. He continued to perform during his college years, while attending Ithaca College where he joined the national music fraternity Phi Mu Alpha as the first accordionist to be offered an invitation in that chapter. For the last several years, Don has focused on the Free Bass Accordion and exploring its use in the Pop and Jazz Idioms by utilizing its flexibility in chord voicings, bass lines and general accompaniment.

Don is also an experienced user of Finale (music notation software) and has used it since 1992, almost from its inception. He uses it to create arrangements, generate materials for students, create transcriptions, as well as composition. Many colleagues use Don as a resource to seek guidance using Finale, as well as troubleshooting technical issues.

EMILIO MAGNOTTA

Emilio Magnotta lives and breathes accordions. Ask anyone he knows and they will tell you, "Emilio lives for accordions."

Emilio began accordion lessons at the age of 5 after becoming enamored with accordions as a toddler. His mother recognized his talents and sought out

the best instructors. Emilio has been privileged to study with accordion maestro Cliff Scholl, as well as coaching from Carmen Carrozza and Mario Tacca. An admirer of the greats, Emilio has framed photographs of the classic accordion players and memorabilia he treasures in his shop

Emilio performs professionally in the NY-metro region and is sought-after for events, such as performing at the Intrepid Sea & Air Museum in NY, Bryant Park, United Nations, as well as weddings and major events.

Emilio recently opened his office in Stamford, CT at 1011 Hope Street, Suite 2E called, what else but, "EmilioAccordions". He handles repairs and new and used instruments and accessories. ■

World Accordion Day – May 6th

The Confederation Internationnale des Accordeonistes Winter Congress voted to approve the continuation of World Accordion Day. Based on the experiences of last year, some enhancements will be made, and there will be the introduction of a policy in the event that there are technical difficulties. For example, if a country is scheduled at 10 pm, and the Internet is off, or the connection is lost at the home country or such, then rather than push everyone back an hour throwing the entire schedule off, it will be rescheduled during another part of the broadcast or allotted breaks, as a couple of built in buffer zones will be used to help accommodate any delays/problems. Several members of the CIA Executive Board including President, Raymond Bodell and Ambassador, Kevin Friedrich are planning to assist Frederic Deschamps and Grayson Masefield in the live broadcast. The proposed budget for this event was approved. ■

A Rare Glimpse Behind the Scenes of "Evita" with Eddie Monteiro (by Kevin Friedrich)

Renowned East Coast accordionist and AAA Board of Directors member, Eddie Monteiro, recently concluded his year-long engagement as accordionist and keyboardist in the popular Broadway production "Evita" starring mega pop star Ricky Martin as Che, and Argentinean Elena Roger as Eva.

Fellow Board of Director, Rita Davidson, and I were lucky enough to sit next to Eddie in the orchestra pit for one of Eddie's last performances as "Evita" came to a close, to see how the show came together from the musician's point of view.

After a tour of the set, including a cameo photo opportunity on the balcony from where the blockbuster "Don't Cry for Me Argentina" is sung, and meeting the Musical Director of the show, Kristen Blodgett, Rita and I took our places in the pit next to Eddie who proceeded to deliver perfection over the next two hours, as he executed a rather demanding accordion part, coupled with his doubling on synthesizer.

With limited visibility of the musical director, no visibility whatsoever of the actual production happening on stage, and the percussionist being in another room all together, each Music Stand had a closed circuit video monitor focused on the conductor. With limited access to the sound of the other musicians, the overall balance was in the hands of the sound engineer, who had his job down to a science.

As the thunderous applause from the audience welcomed Ricky Martin to one of his opening numbers, virtually a duet between Ricky on stage and Eddie underneath, Eddie was in his element. Without batting an eyelid, Eddie was performing under the demands of a high profile gig, accompanying one of the biggest pop stars in the world today, surrounded by nothing but respect from his fellow musicians. Having heard the show from out in the audience a few days earlier, the accordion echoed magnificently throughout the theatre, at the hands of the master musician.



Accordionists to Appear at East Brunswick Cultural Arts Center

On the May 4th concert, Karl, Justin, and Albert will perform as soloists and with the Accordion Pops Orchestra under the baton of Al Terzo. 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Behind the Scenes of 'Evita'

During our pre-show tour, Eddie had explained the procedure of technical glitches as it pertained to the musicians, and in particular to the electronic instruments. Amazingly, in a rare situation in the early part of the show, such a predicament arose. As Eddie transitioned to the synthesizer, there was no sound from his monitor, so while his performance was still being heard, he could hear nothing at all, rather a disconcerting situation. Without ruffling so much as a feather, while one hand was playing his part, another was signaling the situation to the technical assistant, who arrived immediately as expected, and without missing a note, Eddie continued playing while explaining the problem, and within a short time, all was back in order, and before Rita and I knew it, Eddie had already strapped his accordion back on, and was on to his next number.

Having seen several shows that showcase the accordion, most are under the hands of a keyboardist with no previous accordion experience, who doubles on the accordion. It has been frustrating to see the under-utilized potential of our instrument in these high profile moments. "Evita" was a different and welcome change! It was easily recognizable from the Conductor, Kristen Blodgett and Assistant Conductor, William Waldrop, as well as the other highly sought after musicians, that to have an expert accordionist and musician such as Eddie, was so greatly appreciated.

Congratulations to Eddie for his work in doing what could only be expected from any professional musician... delivering! Rita and I were so lucky to have this rare glimpse into the behind the scenes work of the all-important musical side of the professional pit orchestra, where perfection and dependability is standard fare! Eddie, we salute you! ■

Roland Digital Accordion Orchestra

On January 20, 2013, the first rehearsal of the newly formed USA Roland V Accordion Orchestra was held in the performance hall of Falcetti Music in Springfield, MA.

At that time, no one really knew what to expect including the orchestra's conductor, Sam Falcetti who was excited to see his dream become a reality. From the first selection, "Stars & Stripes Forever" with the blending of flutes, clarinets, trumpets, saxes and baritone horns, it was truly the sound of a marching band. Even the wonderful piccolo counter-melody on the last section, (usually performed with the piccolo reed sound of the accordion), had the true piccolo sound.

Next, the orchestra rehearsed the "Godfather Medley" and employed the beautiful French musette accordion sound blending with clarinets, counter-melodies with mandolin and accompanied by strings and vibes.

Everyone was excited about doing a Duke Ellington big band arrangement by John Franceschina. This arrangement is divided into sax, trumpet, and trombone sections, backed by a great

rhythm section and vocalists. Last but not least, the Orchestra rehearsed "Quartet in D" by Haydn. Everyone was amazed by the violin, viola, and cello sections sounding just like a string orchestra.

The Roland V Accordion Orchestra is comprised of students, accordion hobbyists, and a few semi-pro players from Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Rhode Island. This first rehearsal taught everyone how versatile the Roland V Accordion is by simulating the bowing of the violin, the changing of the embouchure on woodwind and brass instruments using the velocity of the bellows, the touch sensitivity of the mallet percussion keyboard and the plucked string instruments.

The Orchestra will have their premier performance in the Festival Band category at the New England Music Festival's 51st event at the Newton Marriott in Newton, Massachusetts on Sunday, April 7, 2013.

Accordionist Receives Optimistic Review

Accordionist John Custie recently received a positive summary of his performance in the following review reprinted with permission by writer, Sara Piali.


The program was previewed as follows: *The Accordion Then and Now: What comes to mind when somehow says accordion? Octoberfest? Lawrence Welk? The Polka?* The accordion was at its height of popularity following World War II and into the 50s and early 60s, but became marginalized in the era of rock and roll by the electric guitar. Today, the accordion is enjoying a resurgence among musicians and accordion enthusiasts. Join professional musician and teacher John Custie who will play both traditional and digital accordion music and explore the history and vast capabilities of the versatile accordion.

"The accordion is an instrument that keeps moving forward. Rather than a static instrument, John Custie proved in his performance on February 3rd, 2013 that the proverbial "squeeze box" has been part of the evolution of music ever since it arrived in America. And it continues to resonate with the creative scene today. John wove a narrative in between each song and each era, from "She'll Be Comin' Round the Mountain" to "Satin Doll."

"It was interesting to hear about the internal adjustments to the instrument made at each stage, and how they contributed to the modern sound we now enjoy. However, it was when the dialogue became anecdotal that the performances took on a life of their own. As John described the discovery his 1960s band mates made – that his accordion could fill their need for a bass better than any other instrument, you could almost hear the audience tune their antennae for the next song. By the time we'd reached the 1970s with "YMCA," the listeners had full faith. It wouldn't be a John Custie performance without something unexpected. The hip-hop performance of "Our Day Will Come" was authentic and flowed!

"John's accordion accomplished something culturally transcendental that night. It moved the accordion from relic to reactionary, from antiquated to front and center in the creative process again. With an experience like this, the next generation will be incorporating the accordion into their music scene for decades to come." ■



Grammy Award Winning Band Features Accordionist

Mumford & Sons' second studio CD "Babel," released in September 2012, won the coveted Grammy Award for Album of the Year at the recent Grammy Awards. "Babel" debuted at number one in both the UK and the USA, becoming the fastest selling album of 2012 in the UK, and the second-biggest selling debut album in 2012 in the USA.

Mumford & Sons are an English folk-rock band, whose member includes Ben Lovett - vocals, accordion and keyboards. ■

AAA Open Meeting Events in Whippany, NJ

The AAA Open Meeting will be held on Sunday, March 17, 2013 at 2:00 p.m. at the Hanover Marriott, 1401 Route 10 East, Whippany, New Jersey. This important and informative event takes place immediately following the AAMS Awards Ceremony. All are welcome. Free admission. Refreshments will be served.

At this time, AAA Historian Joan Grauman, will present a lively demonstration of "Nine Decades of the Accordion in the Media." Joan will present little-known facts about the early founders of the AAA, their important contributions and unique input into the development of the piano accordion as we know it today.

On March 9, 1938, twelve distinguished accordionists and colleagues convened to determine whether or not an association for accordionists should be formed. The meeting was presided over by Sam Roland and included Charles Magnante, Abe Goldman, Joe Biviano, Pietro Deiro, Pietro Frosini, Gene Von Hallberg, Anthony Galla-Rini, Charles Nunzio, Sydney B. Dawson, Sam Roland and Byron Streep (absent from meeting was John Gart). Upon a motion made and seconded, the above-named, including John Gart, formed the charter membership and decided that the name of this association was to be The American Accordionists' Association.

So much accordion history has been made since that meeting in 1938! Competitions were organized. Carnegie Hall Concerts featured top accordionists of the day. Composers were commissioned to expand the accordionists' library. Colleges and universities opened their doors to accordionists as music majors.

Many of you might remember competitions at Peter Stuyvesant High School and Charles Evans Hughes High School both in New York City. Or how about those concerts at Carnegie Hall with capacity crowds? Or looking at some of the early commissioned works and being excited over trying them for the first time? Or having the thrill of being accepted into a college music program and auditioning on your accordion?

The Confédération Internationale des Accordéonistes (CIA) recently met for their 129th General Assembly in Vienna, Austria. Delegates attended from United Kingdom, Germany, Russia, France, Finland, Serbia, Italy, Bosnia, Sweden, USA, as well as a large contingent from the Winter Congress and 2014 Coupe Mondiale host, Austria.

Plans are in full swing for the 2013 Coupe Mondiale in Victoria, BC to be held immediately at the conclusion of the AAA 75th Anniversary Festival in New York, with several AAA and CIA officials scheduled to attend both events.

The Coupe Mondiale festival is pleased to be offering almost \$50,000 in cash and prizes. The host, the BC Accordion Society, will

be awarding prizes down to 5th place, and free accommodation hosting is available to all contestants who wish to take advantage of it.

In addition, the hosts have arranged with Air Canada for a 15% discount on all travel to the Coupe if desired. On March 18th, full details on accommodation, travel discounts, all inclusive ticket package plans and other promotional offers will be published.

In response to the ongoing discussion, it was decided that in addition to our regular coverage of the Coupe Mondiale event, including static images and text and a video archive and online coverage, that the Coupe Mondiale would be "Live Streamed" this year. Fred Deschamps and his technical assistant, Mike Rossi, will work to arrange all the necessary details and the budget was approved to make this all happen.
